ATTENDANCE

Our target for this year is **96.5%** and we will update you on our progress in every newsletter. Last year our whole school attendance was **94.8%** so we want to improve on that this year.

We will continue to recognise those with 100% each term, by entering them into a draw to win a £5 WHSmith voucher. We will also recognise those whose attendance remains above our school target of **96.5%** throughout the school year in our celebration assemblies.

Please do not book holidays in term time, thank you.

REWARDS

This year on Fridays we will be having our celebration assembly. It is a time when teachers choose 2 children from each class to receive a Headteachers award for following one of our values. We would like parents and carers to be invited into school when their child receives a Headteachers award so we have moved our assembly times to accommodate this at the start of the day.

would like to open our doors more in school, so are making this change. We are unable to give you any more notice as the awards are based on the previous week.

The earlier time for assemblies will also allow the time for children who may be struggling at the start of the day to have a soft start.

UNDERWATER CLASS

The Reception children have settled into school really well. They have been busy getting to know each other by talking about their chatter boxes and drawing self-portraits. Please be aware that PE will now be on a Monday and Friday.

WELLY WALK

On a Friday at 1:10 pm the infants will be going on a welly walk. When we start to go off-site we will require additional adult support, if you're able to support us please do let us know. For this term these take place on Pelham field so that the children can learn what welly walk is all about and set expectations.

Children will need to bring in suitable clothing to change into for their woodland slot.

REMINDERS

We would like to remind you that the playground is not supervised before 8.30am and children should not be left unattended before this time as there is no one to safeguard their welfare. We have breakfast club 2 times per week (Mondays and Thursdays), which may help those of you who find getting to work a rush, further details can be found in this newsletter.

Please can we ask everyone to be mindful of safety when driving and parking on Church Lane and in the village car park. This can also cause issues for our neighbours who cannot access their property. Please allow extra time to park and drive slowly down the lane, thank you.

A little reminder that we are a **NUT FREE** school and pack lunches from home must not contain any foods containing nuts, including chocolate spread, cereal bars etc. We continue to promote healthy eating in school and therefore ask that chocolate bars and sweets are not included in packed lunches. Small chocolate covered biscuits – Kit Kats, Penguin bars etc are fine. As a rule of thumb, if it is in the biscuit aisle, it is a biscuit; therefore, ok in school.



KS2 FRUIT AND SNACKS

All KS1 and EYFS children are given a fruit or vegetable snack through the government healthy school initiative. If you would like your child to receive this in KS2 then you will need to order through the office. The cost of this is £7.50 per full term.

If you wish your child to bring in a snack from home then please make sure that it is only fresh fruit or vegetables, thank you.

ARBOR PARENT PORTAL

All new parents will now have received a link to log in to the Arbor Parent Portal. We hope that this will help make administrative task easier to manage as well as the booking of clubs and any planned trips. If you have any difficulties, please do let Mrs Geer in the office know, who will be able to support you.

UNIFORM

It is great to see the children back in their full school uniform. Please ensure that they stick to the correct uniform; see below.

- Green or white polo or white shirt
- School sweatshirt/ fleece
- Green cardigan/ V neck jumper
- Grey trousers/shorts/culottes/skirt/pinafore
- White or grey socks, grey or green tights
- Green and white checked summer dress
- Black shoes/ boots (no sandals please)
- Long hair tied back
- No jewellery except for small plain stud earrings and a watch
- No nail varnish or make up

We will continue to have a uniform draw each term on a random day when all the children, who are in the correct school uniform on that day will have their names go into a hat and one will be picked out for each class. The winner

will receive a £5 WH Smith voucher. This is to help support our uniform policy. If you are having any difficulties purchasing a uniform then please speak to the school office.

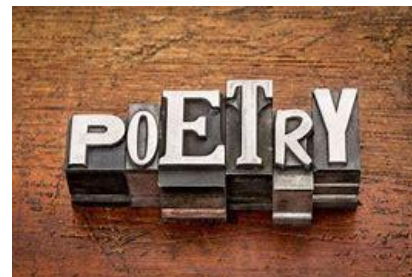
Please make sure that any long hair e.g. reaching shoulders is tied back and avoid elaborate accessories.

POETRY COMPETITION

On Monday 15th September we will be launching a poetry competition for years 1-6. The children will get to choose a poem that they will learn off by heart from a selection of poems. The categories are KS1, Lower KS2, and Upper KS2. All the children will learn at least a part of one of the poems but if they want to be in the competition they will need to be able to recite the whole poem as a performance.

They will share what they can recite in class. If they do not want to recite it in front of the class, they can share it in smaller groups or with a member of staff. Those that want to enter the competition will compete in class and then the finalists from each class will be heard in our whole school assembly on **Monday 29th September**. From this, a finalist will be selected to go to the finals at Ringmer Primary School on the afternoon of **Thursday 2nd October**. This competition is between the local primary schools and is to promote the reading of poetry and develop skills in memorising text.

At the start of every academic year, we update our contact details for the children. I'm sure you can appreciate it is imperative that we have up to date information in case of an emergency.

We have the first of our Open Sessions for parents and carers with children due to start school in September 2025 on **Monday 13th October 2025 at 9.15am & 1.30pm**. The session will last a maximum of 45 minutes, and you will have the opportunity to meet with the Executive Headteacher, Rachel West.

The ESCC closing date for applications is **15th January 2026**.

We will continue to celebrate your child's birthday in school with our birthday stickers and table top badge. Please remember not to bring in things to hand out such as sweets, cakes etc. for the whole class as we are trying to promote healthy. Many thanks.



ATTENDANCE PROCEDURES

Whilst this may seem like a lot of information, we are required to enforce our attendance procedures by our Local Authority. We thought it may be useful to remind everybody of our procedures at the start of the year.

As you are all aware, it is important that your child is in school as much as possible.

Ideally, we would aim for children to be in school 100% of the time, however, we also recognise that there may be reasons which are unavoidable, such as illnesses where we would not expect to see your child in school.

If your child is too unwell for school, please let the school office know on the first day of absence by 8.45am, and each subsequent day. You can either email in or leave a message on the absence line (Option 2) by calling the office number 01323 811306. Any unexplained absence will be recorded as unauthorised, and prolonged unauthorised absence could result in a fixed penalty from ESCC.

The morning session starts at 8.45am. If your child is late after the close of registration they need to be brought in via the main office to be signed in, where they will receive a 'U' registration code. If they are late before the register closes, the teacher will mark them on the register as late with an 'L'. We are aware of children who find coming into school a challenge. Please be assured, that we will work together with families, to support transition into school. Please do let us know if you have any concerns.

Please can we take the opportunity to remind you that holidays are not authorised in term time. Any absence from school can affect your child's progress with their learning. A new National Penalty Notice Framework came into effect from 19 August 2024. All holidays taken in term time (of 10 learning sessions, which do not have to be consecutive) incur a penalty fine of £160 per child per parent, or £80 if paid within 21 days. A session is am or pm. We have attached the term dates you may find useful when planning holidays. Please complete a withdrawal from learning request if you need to take your child out of school for any reason other than illnesses. Please can we encourage you to book medical appointments outside of the school day whenever possible.

We will continue to review everybody's attendance every three weeks, from the end of term 1, as part of our attendance policy, and will write to all parents whose children are at risk of persistent absence based on the Local Authority set target of 10%. We understand that there are a number of reasons for absence, and we would like to work closely with you to support you in every possible way that we can. You can view your child's current attendance by logging into the Parent Portal. Thank you for your support with this.

SCHOOL DINNERS

From September, a daily lunch for KS2 children will cost **£3.06**, therefore a weekly cost of **£15.30**. Just a reminder that pupils moving into Year 3 will have to register for Parent pay if their child is having paid school dinners from September. The school office sent out the registration codes this week. Please let the office know if you haven't received this. The menu for this term can be found attached to this newsletter, or on the school website.

Please could everyone ensure that their parent pay accounts have no outstanding balances at the end of every week. This will help the office as we will not have to chase any debt owed as this can take up a lot of time for office staff. If there remains an outstanding balance on a Friday, you will be asked to send a packed lunch in for the following week, or until the debt is paid. Thank you for your support with this.



BREAKFAST CLUB

Breakfast club has started on a **Monday** and **Thursday** starting from **7:45am**. Children are provided with a nutritious breakfast, comprising of a choice of healthy cereals, toast, fruit, yoghurt or pancakes. Children will participate in an activity until 8:30am when they will join the other children on the playground and be supervised by the teacher on duty.

The sessions are **£5 per child per session**, which will include breakfast and participation in the activity that day. This can be paid for by you Arbor Parent Portal. To ensure the sustainability of the club we will require parents and carers to sign up to this termly, as we need 2 members of staff to run it. You can select your days and we will offer places on a first come, first served basis. You do, however, need to book a minimum of 1 session per week. If you would like to book a place from September for the first term, please contact the school office. Places must be booked in advance and you will then be contacted to confirm your place.

We do need more children to attend these to make them viable and are particularly short on a Monday so please let us know if this would be helpful for you to access.
