Thursday 8th December 2pm

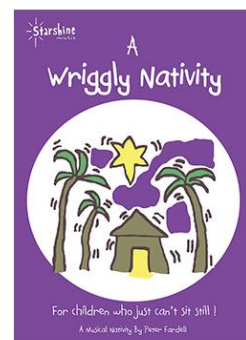
A letter will be sent out next week regarding booking tickets for the performances.

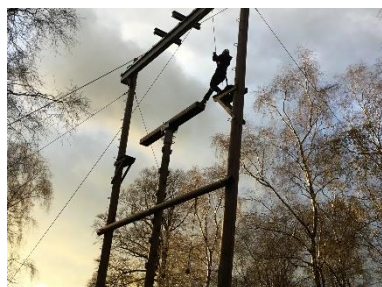
Congratulations to Alice, Maisie, Arlo and Kit who made it through to the finals which will be held in Lewes in January.

SUPPORT AND FREE SCHOOL MEALS

We are aware that the impact of changes to the cost of living have affected many of our families in terms of jobs and money coming in. We are here to offer support if anyone needs anything so please just ask. You can contact the school office and any help or advice can be given in confidence.

Some of you may be eligible for free school meals. This means that your child can receive a free meal at school. You can do this if you receive any of the following benefits:

- [Universal Credit](#) – if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- [Income Support](#)
- Income-based [Jobseekers Allowance](#)
- Income-related [Employment and Support Allowance](#)
- Support under [Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999](#)
- The Guaranteed element of State [Pension Credit](#)

- **Child Tax Credit only**, if your annual household income (assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) isn't over £16,190. [Anyone getting **Working Tax Credit** **won't get** free meals regardless of income]
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Children will get free school meals if they meet the criteria and are in school both before and after lunchtime.

Children eligible for free school meals on or after 1 April 2018 will remain eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on 31 March 2023 even if your circumstances change.

The school also receives additional funding to support your child in their learning and this can be used to help with resources, uniform, trips e.t.c.

The process is not taking very long at the moment and can all be done on online. See link for further information and the application form.

LOCAL TRANSPORT PLAN

East Sussex County Council is consulting on their fourth Local Transport Plan. This Plan will look at improving transport and travel to better connect people to places between 2023 and 2050. They want to know your views on county-wide transport issues, opportunities and priorities which will affect you and

PENALTY NOTICES

East Sussex County Council can issue a penalty notice for parents or carers who don't ensure that their child goes to school. The fine is £120 per parent per child. If you pay within 21 days this is reduced to £60 per parent per child.

- Holidays in term time – 10 sessions (5 school days) or more
- Unauthorised absences – 10 sessions (5 school days) within 10 school weeks
- Unauthorised lateness – if a pupil arrives at school after the register has closed 10 times in 10 school weeks
- A combination of unauthorised absence and lateness

We regularly monitor our attendance and punctuality and are reviewed by East Sussex to check that we are fulfilling these obligations. If you are liable for a penalty notice we will send you a warning letter first, and if things do not improve, the local authority will issue a penalty notice.
