We had a lovely Harvest assembly last week. Many thanks for your donations. We have received this message from the Hailsham Foodbank. 'Thank you for your donation of food to Hailsham Foodbank, we weigh all our donations as this helps us to provide information to our donors. The donation we received from you, weighed 136.15kg, this will enable us to provide emergency food for 6 families.

Without the generous support of those within the community we would struggle to meet the needs of those who use the foodbank. We have seen a significant increase in use of the foodbank during the last 6 months, compared to this time last year.

#### ECO UPDATE

What a wet week! The rain has been coming down and it has seemed non stop! Our intrepid Eco Warriors have met and we discussed more of what they can do to make a difference! We also visited one of the few rooms in the school nobody ever sees... the boiler room! They learnt how important it is that the boiler is run efficiently and is only on for the times it needs to be and only heating the rooms to a certain temperature. Over the two weeks either side of half term the Eco Warriors will be actively monitoring the thermometers in their classrooms for me to get any idea of how effectively the boiler is running.

On Tuesday I had the honour to give a talk to 65 primary school and 20 secondary school students from all the Heathfield area schools.
