STARFISH MALAWI



Laughton CP School has now joined Firle CEP School in supporting this charity. We are linked with Thawale School in Malawi which will provide opportunities for children in all three schools to learn about each other's cultures and hopefully to communicate with each other. We will hold events across the year to raise money for the charity - more details to follow.

On Monday the children in all classes across both schools in The Oak Tree Federation enjoyed learning activities as part of **Starfish Malawi Day**, which will now be a yearly event. Learning included comparing domestic and wild



animals in England and Malawi; finding out about water in Malawi; comparing and contrasting trees in both countries and learning about the importance of trees for a healthy planet.

LSA
