#### REMEMBRANCE

The whole school met for 2 minutes silence this morning at 1 l o'clock to remember those who had died in war and conflict. High Peaks' class had produced some lovely drawings which they shared during the assembly.

#### NEW PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT

Mr Herdman was successful in bidding for funding to get a table tennis table and musical instruments for our school and the local community. He has installed these at Chiddingly and East Hoathly Primary Schools and they have been a great success. We would

like to thank him for his hard work developing this project and hope everyone gets a lot of enjoyment both at school and in the community, playing with them.

Please remind your children that the table tennis table is only to be used with a table tennis bat and ball and to not go near it when on bikes or scooters. The instruments are low sounding but please ensure that they are used properly and do not cause disturbance to our neighbours. This shouldn't be an issue if they are used properly. If they do cause distress to our neighbours then their use will be restricted and we will have to look at methods of covering them. Thank you.

#### LINK SCHOOL

We are supporting a school in Ethiopia through the Link Ethiopia project. This

enables us to link learning with children in Ethiopia and learn more about their culture. In return we raise money for their school to support resourcing their learning needs. We have an assembly planned shortly to relaunch this project with the children.

Each year we give our children and families the option of designing a Christmas card to the whole school instead of spending money on cards to send to individuals. These cards are then displayed in the hall so that everyone can read the message. We recommend a minimum donation of £5 for the card poster that can be collected from the school office. If you would like to purchase a card for this cause they will be available in the office from 21<sup>st</sup> November. Thank you.

#### **CHILDREN IN NEED**

You will have received a letter regarding the School Council plans for raising money for Children in Need. Their event is on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> November in the afternoon. The children are invited to dress in spots, yellow or both and donate  $\pounds I$  on this day. Sponsorship forms for the 'Spotty Mile' should now have been sent home so please encourage your children to starts raising money. We will attach the letter again with this newsletter. We would be

grateful for any cake donations for our cake stall in the afternoon. A separate email will be sent with regards to this. Please bring the cakes in on Wednesday morning. We look forward to seeing as many of you who can make it.







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#### **GOLDEN MILE**

We have been successful in an application for a Schools Health Grant from Public Health and one of our projects is called the Golden Mile. This is a new initiative to get all the children participating in active learning using our school and local environment. Premier Sport are facilitating it and will be promoting the Golden Mile in our School. This involves marking out different tracks in school, in the playground, on the field and through the woods so that the children can measure how far they walk, jog and run throughout the year on these tracks. The aim is for each child to cover at least 50 miles over the year. This is logged on a child friendly system so that they can keep a track of their distance and even have competitions with other classes and schools!

Sometimes they will run round the track but it can also be used as part of their learning e.g. walking in pairs sharing ideas, reflecting on learning using talking partners etc. We hope it will enable the children to get out of the classroom more often and also increase their levels of fitness along the way.

We will be introducing the programme to you on 16th November for Children in Need for which you can take part and gain sponsorship. Some children from Years 5 and 6 have become Golden Mile Monitors and will ensure that distances get logged so that everyone can track their progress.

#### **FLU VACCINES**

Children in Years 1, 2 and 3 will be having the scheduled flu vaccines on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> November. A letter was sent out about this earlier last term.
