ECO UPDATE

As we enter the final term of the current selection Eco Warriors time in their role we can see all the great stuff they have been doing like the clematis growing up the pergola in the quiet area or the two new white-beams growing fast in the car park. This week the Eco Warriors delivered an assembly to the whole school about the recent climate protests by both school children and Extinction Rebellion which was great to hear about. We are already making plans for next year in what we want to achieve and are looking it at how we can reduce the amount of single use plastic that is used in school including packed lunches and looking at how we can expand our current recycling streams of pens, biscuit wrappers and crisp packets!



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This years Eco Warriors have done an amazing job and is great to see them carrying out their responsibilities with such enthusiasm and dedication.

This week we welcomed a visit from Mrs Sumners from Surfers against Sewage who delivered an informative assembly about how bad single use plastic is and what damage it is doing in our oceans. All of the children listed well and there were some amazing questions. We will be looking at some of the ideas coming out of this such as banning 3 items of single use plastic from school and also writing to businesses and the government to challenge use of single use plastic.

Laughton has also signed up to the Duracell big battery hunt and collection boxes will be given out in class this week. Please fill your boxes up at home and bring in as many batteries as possible. Please hand in to the office or to Mr Herdman.

Lastly the LSA have signed up to the World Wildlife Fund 'Wear it wild' day where we want you to come to school dressed in wildlife or animal themed inspired clothing! The planet has lost 60% of its wildlife populations in less than 50 years and the WWF work with many countries to protect habitats. **The 'Wear it wild' day will be on Friday 28th June** and children are asked to bring in £1 which will go to the WWF to help their work!



All of the classes have been doing an amazing job of being Eco friendly however one class shone out from the rest so this time Eco Ernie goes to Underwater! Well done!!!
