#### **ANTI BULLYING WEEK**

We had Anti bullying week last week and the children accessed a range of activities around the subject of bullying and how to stop it. We are a telling school so if anyone sees or is subject to any bullying, they must tell an adult so that it can be dealt with.

'One of the things we did was Mrs Dann found a short clip called 'Wing' and there was a short humanoid who got bullied by some crows. One had a wing and one didn't. The one who didn't have a wing was always being bullied by the crows. The humanoid with both wings distracted the crows but then they broke one of her wings so she couldn't fly. At the end both of the humanoids decided to join together and fly away together. We learnt that if someone is being bullied you should try to help them. We have also made our own story with the same plot as 'Wing' I have nearly finished mine.

In assembly we were told that if you see someone being bullied or you are being bullied then you must tell an adult. Bullying isn't once or twice, it's constant.' By Ebony

Ringmer is one scheduled for closure and we wanted to give you the opportunity to comment before the consultation deadline on 14 December. - 2. You may feel that the consultation form is very structured, aimed to lead to responses that ESCC favour and people have commented that it is almost impossible to answer in any other way. So the Save Ringmer library campaign has also produced a questionnaire for parents and another for children. The response to these questionnaires are really helping to build up a picture of how the closure of our libraries will affect the community, and the more we have the better our views can be expressed to the relevant people.
- 3. However the most effective form of help is to write individual letters or send emails to those who represent us, or have a role in making decisions about the library service. There is a 'key facts' letter available to help, including a list of the decision makers, if you'd like to do this.
