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VACANCY FOR CLEANER

We have decided to employ our own cleaner in the new financial year rather than continuing with the previous contractors. Therefore we are advertising for a school cleaner. We are looking for someone who:

Has an eye for detail and takes pride in the quality of their work,

Has a clear understanding of the needs of a school,

Can integrate well into a community and team,

Will take pride in their role within the school,

Can prioritise their own workload and respond to unexpected needs,

Has excellent communication and interpersonal skills,

Preferably some experience in cleaning and using cleaning machinery, though training will be given.

The position is for 13 hours per week for 44 weeks of the year and working hours would be 4pm to 6.30pm Monday to Thursday and 4pm until 7pm on Fridays. In the school holidays (Easter and summer) there would be the opportunity to condense hours which would be mutually agreed with the school.

SAFEGUARDING

We would like to remind you that Operation Encompass goes live on 1st April 2019. You will have received a letter about this from the police through the school office.

Operation Encompass directly connects the police with schools to secure better outcomes for children who are subject or witness to police-attended incidents of domestic abuse. Rapid provision of support within the school environment means children are better safeguarded against the short, medium and long-term effects of domestic abuse.

We learnt about how much light in a tunnel is produced through different measurements and angles e.g. a 90 degrees etc. It was really fun and at the end we had 1/2hr to build a tower from art straws that would

'One of the activities was a wooden tunnel with a light at the end and you had a mirror that went into the tunnel but acted as a solar panel and we had to see what the temperatures were on the solar panel at different measurements away. We had to record them and put them on a graph. We also had to record the temperatures of the mirror at different angles. We also put a marshmallow in a vacuum and watched it expand.
