PARENT FORUM

Thank you to those who were able to come to our forum on Tuesday. We discussed items that parents would like to know more about and suggestions were made about which workshops would be helpful to give more information about children's learning. These included a SAT's meeting for yr 6 parents, an IT workshop where the children showed what they learnt on lpads, laptops and how to code roamers and Beebots, further information on e-safety and a workshop on healthy eating and nutrition for children.

Congratulations on achieving your Eco-Schools Bronze Award

For our achievements in promoting energy efficiency and being green

Well done to Mr Herdman, Mrs Pratt and their team of Eco warriors.

Last year we had a great set of Eco Warriors who did a tremendous job in helping make our school more eco aware! This year we are looking at recruiting a new group to work with. Mr Herdman spoke to the entire school in assembly last Friday and explained what the Eco Warriors do and what a high standard the new Eco Warriors will have to reach following last year's group. This year, instead of being chosen, the children have been asked to apply for the post. Each class have a pile of application forms to fill out, which when completed should either go to the office or posted in the green Eco suggestion box in the hall. The two best applicants from each class will form our new Eco Warrior group. Our Eco meetings last year were held fortnightly at 8.15am in the hall and we supplied free breakfast to all the children. We would be looking at a similar arrangement this year. If your child is interested in being an Eco Warrior please ask your class teacher for a form or speak to Mr Herdman.





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UNIVERSITY RESEARCH

We have been asked by Sussex University if we would like to take part in a research project they are carrying out to do with gender and diversity. I have attached the information about it with this newsletter. It is an exciting piece of research to find out how children perceive voices and occupations in regard to gender.

I will be sending out further letters next week for permission from parents for their child/ren to take part. The school will also receive a small amount of funding for each study. This will go towards class resources.

PARENT PAY

Please can you not ask your child to order a school dinner if you don't have sufficient funds in you Parent Pay account. Our school cook is increasingly put in a difficult position when her company ask her why there are arrears on accounts. The account must be in credit. If you have any difficulty in accessing Parent Pay, please contact them directly to get help to set it up. Children in KS1 and EYFS continue to have free school meals so this only applies to parents in KS2.

SCHOOL CENSUS

Thursday 5th October is school census day and there will be a special dinner menu of Fish Fingers or veggie lasagne with chips, designed to be especially popular with children. The more children in Reception, Year I and Year 2 that have a school dinner that day, the more funding the school receives. Dinners are free for all children in Underwater and Bugs so please let them have a school dinner that day if possible – it really helps us. Thank you in advance for your cooperation

SCHOOL ACCESS

We are experiencing a high number of children and parents accessing the school before 8.45am and after school has finished. Please can we remind you that people should not be coming into school and classrooms before 8.45am as this is the time when staff are trying to prepare themselves for the day.

Please remind children to go to the toilet as they come out at 3pm, if you are planning on staying to play outside. There are a great deal of children trying to come in through the front door after 3pm and there is not always somebody in the office to let them in and out, or monitor them in the building. Once school has ended at 3pm, unless children are attending an after school club with a designated adult supervisor, they should not be re-entering the building. Thank you.

SCHOOL ROUTINES

Now that we have settled into the school routine there will be information sent home on various occasions either by email or hard copy. Please ensure that your child comes to school each day with a book bag to bring anything home.

Children also need a water bottle in school every day, kept separate from their book bag to avoid spills. Please could I remind parents to ensure that all your child's belongings are clearly labelled to avoid confusion. We already have quite a collection of unnamed items heading into lost property.
