REMINDERS

Please can we remind you that packed lunches from home must be NUT FREE, including chocolate spreads containing nuts. We continue to promote healthy eating at school and therefore ask that chocolate bars and sweets are not included in packed lunches. Small chocolate covered biscuits- Kit Kats, Penguin bars etc are fine. As a rule of thumb, if it is in the biscuit aisle, it is a biscuit; therefore ok in school.





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READY FOR SEPTEMBER

In preparing for new class teachers we are asking all children who are working at home to complete a pupil passport for their new teacher and return it to their current class teacher before the holiday. This is to help with transition in September. The children at school will do these in school. We will give further information on transition before the end of term to explain how we are going to support your child in September as we are still awaiting further guidelines from the government on how schools open to all pupils. We are basing our current planning on full classes returning but possibly needing to not mix groups and continue with staggering the entry, playtimes, lunchtimes and end of day. We will stick as close as we can to our normal hours of 8:45-3p.m

SUPPORT AND FREE SCHOOL MEALS

We are aware that the situation over the last few months may have affected many of our families in terms of jobs and money coming in. We are here to offer support if anyone needs anything so please just ask. You can contact the school office and any help or advice can be given in confidence.

Some of you may be eligible for free school meals. This means that your child can either receive a free meal at school or if they are not in school you can have a voucher sent to you for £15 a week. This is £90 over the summer holidays. You can do this if you receive any of the following benefits:

<u>Universal Credit</u> – if you apply on or after I April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Income Support

Income-based Jobseekers Allowance

Income-related Employment and Support Allowance

Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

The Guaranteed element of State Pension Credit

<u>Child Tax Credit</u> only, if your annual household income (assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) isn't over £16,190. Anyone getting <u>Working Tax Credit</u> won't get free meals regardless of income Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Children eligible for free school meals on or after 1 April 2018 will remain eligible until they finish the phase of schooling (primary or secondary) they're in on 31 March 2023 even if your circumstances change.

The school also receives additional funding to support your child in their learning and this can be used to help with resources, uniform, trips e.t.c.

The process is not taking very long at the moment and can all be done on online. See link for further information and the application form.
