encourage everyone else to be eco friendly. Hannah, one of our Eco Warriors from last year, got up and told everyone about some of the things we did last year and how much she enjoyed it. To become an Eco Warrior, if your child is interested, they need to fill out the application forms that went out on Wednesday to each class. We have included a copy with the newsletter if they have mislaid it! They just need to answer 3 questions and these forms need to be handed in to the office by WEDNESDAY 25th September. Once I have the forms I will pick the 2 best from each class, not an easy process! Eco meetings are held every other Wednesday at 8.15am so it's important that children who apply will be able to attend these early meetings. We provide a breakfast snack and can take siblings as well if necessary.

Lastly to all those parents who are new to Laughton school... as well as recycling paper and cardboard and so on we also do specialist recycling. We have special bins located by the office to recycle crisp packets, biscuit wrappers, pens, ink cartridges and batteries. We especially want your crisp packets, pens and biscuit wrappers as not only are we saving them from going to landfill and recycling them but we also get money for each one we send off. Last year Laughton raised nearly £100 just from crisp packet recycling! We are also providing crisp packet recycling to King's Academy Ringmer, Southover School Lewes, Chiddingly School, East Hoathly School and Six Bells pub Chiddingly... we also encourage local people and businesses to bring them in! 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### **ATTENDANCE**

We need to improve our attendance this year and will work with you to ensure your child is happy in coming to school. If they are unwell and cannot attend school, please let us know by 8:30a.m on each day of absence (unless they have a longer term illness e.g. Chicken Pox). Vomiting and Diarrhoea requires 48hrs since the last episode. Our school target this year is 96.5% however we would like it to be higher! Last year we set our attendance target at 96.5% but unfortunately only achieved 95.6% so we were close but not quite there. Anything under 95% is

We send all our attendance data into County and are informed via a report of children who may become at risk of persistent absence. This is if they fall below the number of sessions set by County for that term.

We will inform you if your child is on this list through a letter at the beginning of the subsequent term. This is a generic letter as we are unable to amend each one for each individual case. If you receive one of these letters and wish to discuss it with myself or Mrs Brown, please make an appointment with the school office. If we have any specific concerns about your child's attendance, we will approach you in person and arrange a meeting.

Please try to avoid booking doctor, dentist and other appointments during the school day and ensure your child is in school on time as late marks are also categorised in our attendance figures. It can be unsettling for children to arrive late to class so please try to leave a bit earlier if you can.

The children need to be registered at 8:45 a.m so we will be closing the gates at this time. If anyone arrives after 9 a.m they will be recorded as late and you will need to sign them in at the school office. Thank you.

We will be celebrating each class attendance at a weekly worship and keep you informed through the school fortnightly newsletter.

### **TRAFFIC**

Please can you take care when driving and parking on the school run as we have had a few collisions and some unsafe parking which has led to children having to walk in the road to get past.
