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CHILDREN IN NEED

Next Friday, 16th November, the School Council is running a toy, book and cake sale to raise money for Children in Need. If you are able to donate any second hand toys, games and books, they can come into school from Monday. There will be a table up in the hall to leave any donations.

On Friday 16th November, children will come into school as normal, in school uniform. They can bring some money for the sale, in a named purse or wallet. The sale will take place from 2pm in the hall and each class will visit with their class teacher.

SKIPPING WORKSHOP

On Tuesday 6th November, all the children took part in skipping workshops. Each class had a session with a specialist skipping coach and learnt new skips and how to skip using a long rope. At the end of the day, some children from each class presented what they had been learning during their sessions to the rest of the school. The children found it really interesting to learn new techniques for skipping and particularly enjoyed working collaboratively with their friends when partner skipping. We look forward to watching them practice these skills in the playground over the coming weeks.
