HARVEST

We would like to thank you all for the very generous donations to Hailsham Food Bank which we collected during our Harvest festival last week. We are delighted to tell you that your generosity meant that we collected **160.85kg** of food which is enough to provide an incredible **383 meals** for families in crisis within Hailsham and the surrounding areas. Thank you for your support.

BREAKFAST CLUB

Our breakfast club will continue to run after half term on a **Monday, Wednesday** and a **Thursday** from **7:45am**. Children are provided with a nutritious breakfast, compromising of a choice of healthy cereals, toast, fruit, yoghurt or pancakes. Children will participate in an activity until 8:35am when they will be walked back to their classrooms ready for the start of the school day.

The sessions are £5 per child per session, which will include breakfast and participation in the activity that day. This can be paid for by BACs or cheque to the school office. To ensure the sustainability of the club we will require parents and carers to sign up to this termly, as we need 2 members of staff to run it. You can select your days and we will offer places on a first come, first served basis. You do, however, need to book a minimum of I session per week.

If you would like to book a place, please contact the school office. Places must be booked in advance; you will then be contacted to confirm your place. If you child is currently attending breakfast club, please could you confirm with the office if you would like to continue in term 2.
