KSI TRIP TO BRIGHTON AND HOVE PROGRESSIVE SYNAGOGUE

As part of our RE focus this term, we have booked a trip for the Year I and Year 2 children to Brighton and Hove Progressive Synagogue. They will be joined by the KSI classes from Firle. At the synagogue, pupils will explore the Torah, make connections to the Christian Bible, and explore traditional Jewish food e.g. Challah. Pupils will have the opportunity to draw features of a synagogue and make comparisons to the features of a church.
