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### **PARTNERSHIP**

Staff met together for a staff meeting to launch and discuss the new maths calculations policy, which has been written collaboratively by Miss Mandy and Miss Anderson, the maths subject leaders. This is now available on our school website. Staff were also able to evaluate the impact of maths mastery on our learners. Later in the week staff worked together at the INSET twilight to look at report writing for this year and also looked at curriculum planning for the rest of the year. It was great to work in groups to come up with some exciting and engaging ideas to use on the classroom.

This week Mrs West, Mrs Brown and Miss Anderson, from Firle, attended a mid-point conference looking at Spirals of Inquiry. This is the new initiative we are using in school to explore different ways to support all children in school. The first step is to really listen to what they say about themselves, their learning and their experience of school. One of the main messages that resonates with us is to work together in order that all children leave our setting with dignity, purpose and options. We have spent time in school checking whether all children are able to name a trusted adult in school who they can always go to, if needed. This can be any member of staff they feel comfortable talking to. It would be great if you could talk to your child this half term and see if they can talk to you about their trusted adult. Please let us know if they can't identify one so that we can work on this in school.

Please can we remind you that the consultation period regarding the proposed federation closes on Thursday 1st March. Firstly we have signed up to 'The Great Big School Clean' initiative for Friday 2nd March. This time Eco Ernie is awarded to Jungle for not only great recycling and turning off lights but also for excellent work about electricity and how it is produced.
