We are delighted that Mr Vening (a parent volunteer) is coming in on Wednesday lunchtimes to help to run a football club with Mr Sidebottom supporting.



### **SPIRALS OF INQUIRY**

Last Thursday Mrs Brown and I attended a conference on Spirals of Inquiry. This is a programme that was founded in British Columbia to close the gap between learners and has been successful in a number of other countries. Both Laughton and Firle have piloted this programme this year which has been funded by ESCC.

The programme involves finding out from the children how they feel about their learning by asking 4 set questions. The responses are then analysed to get a hunch of what may be impacting progress. The staff then use action research to find out more about possible strategies and then implement a change in school to see if it impacts on progress.

Last year Mrs Coakley started a Critque wall in her class for children to comment on each other's work and give valuable feedback on how it could be improved. This has helped them become reflective on their own learning and become more specific in using words to explain how a piece of work can be improved. We found this really supported children and it has been further developed this year. Our aim was to encourage children from an early age to accept feedback and next steps and see them as being positive for their learning. We now hope to share this practice across the school.

We have put a display up in the corridor, which you are welcome to look at.
