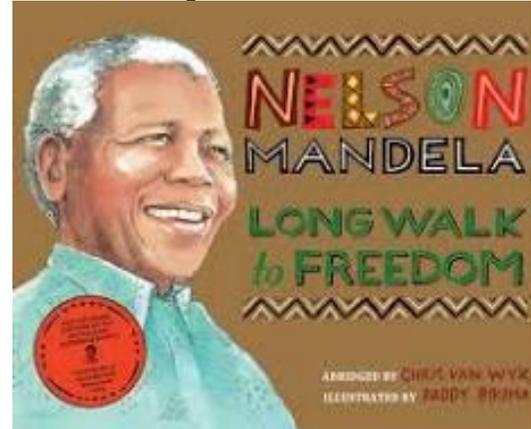




### PSHEe

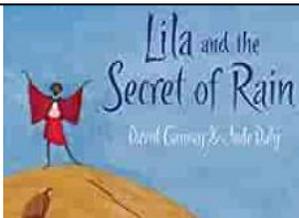


### Music
