BREAKFAST CLUBS

Unfortunately Sports Cool Brighton no longer have the staff availability to run a breakfast club on a Thursday morning. We shall therefore take it back in house as from next term.

Breakfast club will run on a **Monday, Wednesday and Thursday** starting from **7:45am**. Children are provided with a nutritious breakfast, comprising of a choice of healthy cereals, toast, fruit, yoghurt or pancakes.
