Bring your character to life !

You are going to make a character sculpture.

You can make this out of whatever you have at home:

...recycled materials, pipe cleaners, newspaper, playdough, clay, fabric, wooden spoon...



Next you need to write a character portrait.

A character portrait can be likened to a painting of a person using **words instead of paint!** It is a detailed description of a person.

Things to include:

- Write about the physical description of your character
- Write about the character's behavior, how they relate to others and how their life affects others
- Write about the environment you will find your character in
- Write about the reputation of your character
