SCHOOL CLUBS

Breakfast club will continue on a **Monday** and **Wednesday** starting from **7:45am**. Children are provided with a nutritious breakfast and will participate in an activity until 8:35am when they will be walked back to their classrooms ready for the start of the school day.

The sessions are £5 per child per session, and can be paid for by BACs or cheque to the school office. To ensure the sustainability of the club we will require parents and carers to sign up to this termly, as we need 2 members of staff to run it. You can select your days and we will offer places on a first come, first served basis. You do, however, need to book a minimum of I session per week. If you would like to book a place for the second term, please contact the school office by Friday 21st October to reserve your child's place.

On **Thursdays** Sports Cool Brighton will continue to offer a morning club. This will be £5 per session which should be made to the school office. This will start at **8am** and children will also be offered breakfast. Sports Cool Brighton will bring a variety of games and activities dependant on group size, ages and weather, such as

archery, frisbee, and golf etc. They will also have games like Jenga, connect 4, and dominoes for those who prefer quiet time.
