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#### **LSA MOVIE NIGHT**



Last Friday the LSA put on a film night, which was very well attended. The children had the option of watching Nativity 3 or The Incredibles 2. They had a fabulous time, thank you very much to all the volunteers and organisers.

The infants have been busy practising their nativity over the last few weeks and got to perform it to the other children on Tuesday and to parents, carers and family today. They were fantastic and gave a brilliant performance.

### **ECO UPDATE**

With the cold weather upon us, the last Eco meeting was spent discussing with the Eco Warriors how important it is to keep the school at the correct temperature. Too cold and everyone is chilly, too hot and we are not only uncomfortable, but we are also wasting oil and electricity. At Laughton we aim to heat all rooms to 19 degrees centigrade and there are thermometers in every room specially to monitor this. All of the Eco Warriors were asked to monitor these twice a day for a fortnight and I look forward to seeing the results in the next meeting when we will discuss how the temperature can be raised or lowered if necessary. It was also great to see the Eco Warriors take part in the tree planting of the two white beams in the car park and we look forward to taking care of them and watching them grow.

This time last year, our previous Eco Warrior group took part in an assembly on paper usage within the school. Everyone, from Mrs West down, was shocked when we revealed that between 130 people including adults and children we were using a massive 144,000 sheets of A4 printing paper per year! That is the equivalent of 16 large trees. We have introduced lots of ways to try to tackle this and since then we have reduced this amount by 10,000 sheets which is great news but there is still more that can be done to tackle waste in this area.

In the past eight months we have also reduced our water consumption by a massive 50% simply by placing half a brick in every toilet cistern thus reducing the water from each flush whilst electricity consumption is down 10% at the moment which is down to the Eco Warriors work in the classrooms! It is amazing how much we have done to reduce this in the years since I have been here. When I first arrived in July 2013 on average we were consuming around 7,500 KWH per month in electricity alone... it is now 1600 KWH per month... an 80% reduction!!! With the mild weather this winter, we are currently using less oil than is normal at this time of the year to heat the school so across all our utilities we are going really well!

Eco Ernie had a great time in Jungle and has not only learned a great deal about the Second World War but has also enjoyed seeing the Christmas decorations go up in there! All the classes have impressed me and it is hard to decide which is good but this time Eco Ernie is awarded to Bugs class! Well done!!!



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#### PARENT COFFEE MORNING

We are reaching the end of term and have just realised that we have not had the opportunity for a parent coffee meeting/ forum. This is an informal event where parents are invited to meet with either myself or Mrs Brown and a governor to talk about a specific topic and then raise any other items that they would like the school to develop further.

It is a constructive discussion over coffee to help build better communication in gaining parental views. Mrs Brown will be running our next Parent coffee meeting on **Monday 17th December at 8:45 a.m.** and the focus will be on feedback on being a federation.
