RE DAY

We trialled our very first RE day in the last week of term 4. This is something that has been introduced at Firle School and teachers supported each other in the process. The aim is to develop quality in RE by having a focus day where children can learn through a range of activities to support their understanding of RE curriculum and then share it with each other.

Underwater studied new life, Bugs focused on Palm Sunday, High Peaks concentrated on the Last Supper and Jungle studied Good Friday. We had a whole school assembly at the end of the day to share our learning and it was really lovely. We saw Easter gardens, a re- enactment of the procession of Palm Sunday, a tableau of the Last Supper and reflections of the Cross in relation to those who have died in war.

VERT WOODS

Vert Woods Community Woodland is 171 acres of Ancient Woodland located in Laughton.

The committee are in the very early stages of creating the Community Woodland and would like the school to use it as resource in the future.
