BREAKFAST CLUBS

Breakfast club will continue on a **Monday** and **Wednesday** starting from **7:45am**. Children are provided with a nutritious breakfast and will participate in an activity until 8:35am when they will be walked back to their classrooms ready for the start of the school day.

The sessions are £5 per child per session, and can be paid for by BACs or cheque to the school office. To ensure the sustainability of the club we will require parents and carers to sign up to this termly, as we need 2 members of staff to run it. You can select your days and we will offer places on a first come, first served basis. You do, however, need to book a minimum of I session per week. If you would like to book a place for the second term, please contact the school office by Friday I 0th February to reserve your child's place.

On **Thursdays** Sports Cool Brighton will continue to offer a morning club. This will be £5 per session which should be made to the school office. This will start at **8am** and children will also be offered breakfast. Sports Cool Brighton will bring a variety of games and activities dependant on group size, ages and weather, such as archery, frisbee, and golf etc. They will also have games like Jenga, Connect 4, and Dominoes for those who prefer quiet time.



SUPERVISION AFTER SCHOOL

We are aware that many children stay after to school to play and socialise. It is so lovely that we have the outdoor space to facilitate this, particularly as the days are getting longer.

However, we have had a number of incidents brought to our attention by both parents/carers and children in school, of unsocial and challenging behaviour towards each other and of damaging property or the local environment. Often these incidents occur at the very bottom of the field, where children are unsupervised by adults. We want to raise your awareness of this, as we are being informed that this unsupervised time can be challenging and upsetting for many of the children. It is hard for us, as a school to address any behaviour concerns that are taking place after school, when children are unsupervised once they have been collected.

MESSAGE FROM CHARTWELLS

I am writing to you as UK food price rises soared to a record rate in December, figures show, as retail industry bosses warned, that high inflation would continue in 2023.

Within East Sussex it is affecting the school meals contract to a point of operations being untenable without a further in year meal price increase. To give you some context; within the East Sussex contract, on average food prices have risen by a further 7.5% since September alone, this being constantly driven up and not aided by the impact of Russia's war in Ukraine where a lot of foods and feed are sourced.


We have continued to work tirelessly to mitigate the impact being passed on to you as we know families are already struggling with the ongoing cost of living crisis.

We have worked with the catering provider to explore options of menu

reduction, but any other items being removed will directly impact the School Food Standards and quality of the food that is being produced. The scale of the East Sussex contract has allowed our catering provider to protect this element as the number of schools in the contract give better buying power for quality ingredients.

In depth market research has been carried out by ESCC to look at other local authorities and catering providers to ensure our contract has comparable pricing using similar models and we are confident we are in line with others.

Therefore, from Monday 30th January 2023 the meal prices are as follows:



This will be protected until September 1st 2023.
