FOREST SCHOOL

We are nearing the end of our ten Forest School sessions for Laughton's Year 2 and Year 4 pupils, who have been hopping, skipping and sometimes sprinting through Blackshaw Wood every Friday since the start of the January term. We have

observed the changes in seasons, from the starkness of the dormant wood in Winter, to the fresh bursts of groundcover and bird-song which have

merrily greeted us this Spring. The LSA kindly provided some funding for 2017, with which we were able to purchase a giant camp-fire kettle, more fire strikers, protective gloves, a bow saw, loppers and a bill hook. The children are now confident in understanding how to select and safely use the right Forest School tool for the job, whether it's chopping fire wood, whittling stick men, crafting bird feeders and bows or making mallets to take home. They have also enjoyed using the fire to make a natural bee's wax lip balm, melt pine resin to make glue, and cook tasty snacks such as savoury nettle pakoras and rich honey drenched welsh cakes.
