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TRAFFIC

Since the return to school this week, we have been made aware of concerns around the amount of traffic at drop off and pick up times, particularly around parking and the problems it is causing for traffic to move safely up and down the road. We understand there are always challenges on the lane to school, due to the volume of cars and we do ask for your consideration if you have to drive to school.

Can we please ask that the area in front of the village hall is not used for parking by school parents- it should only be used by families accessing The Nest nursery at the village hall.

For Jungle parents, could we ask that they park next to the pavement on the way towards the village. We please ask you to stick to the same side of the road, to allow traffic to pass.

For parents dropping off to Underwater, Bugs and High Peaks, can you please use the main school car park or park along the road down towards the church keeping to the right-hand side (the church side). Children for Bugs can then walk around across the playground to access their drop off point.

We will be contacting the community police to come out and support us with the ongoing issues.

HAND WASHING

We are aware that now we have returned to school, with so much hand washing taking place as part of our Covid hygiene procedures, that many children are experiencing sore and chapped hands. If you wish to send in specific soap or an emollient hand cream for children to use, to alleviate sore hands then this is permissible. Any soap or hand cream must be clearly labelled with your child's name and is solely for their use. No soaps and creams can be shared with other children. Please make the class teacher aware if children bring in their own hand washing products.


