CONTINGENCY

If we get a confirmed case of Covid in school we will be guided by the DfE helpline as to the steps we need to take. We have a contingency plan for this.

Should your child need to self-isolate we will provide work on the learning platform for them from their first day of isolating. If the whole class needs to self-isolate then this will also be the case and teaching will be carried out online. We are currently arranging accounts for Google G- Suite to enable this to happen.

Should the whole school need to self-isolate we would send home a timetable of lessons so that they didn't overlap with siblings (enabling IT availability at home).

To help us prepare for any individual or group self-isolation please could you let us know if you have access to a laptop, IPad or desktop at home. We will then create a list in school of who would need to borrow equipment should circumstances arise. You can do this by email or phone call to the school office stating if you would need to borrow a laptop, thank you.

OPEN SESSIONS

Our next Open Sessions for parents and carers with children due to start school in September 2021 is on Wednesday 18th November 2020. There will be two sessions, the first at 9:15am prompt, and the second at 1:30pm. To ensure we are COVID compliant, only two people are invited from each potential new family. You will need to bring photo ID for safeguarding purposes and also provide your email and contact number when booking your place for track and trace purposes.
